



Howard's father-in-law served aboard this ship. Luck was with the Fanning since she arrived in Pearl Harbor on Dec. 8, 1941! She was built in 1935 and decommissioned in 1946.





Justin Camarata: Chance Meeting. Two brothers from Noank, CT, were both captains of sailing ships. During the summer of 1874 one captain was on a voyage from Liverpool to San Francisco. His brother was taking his ship from SanFrancisco to New York. Their courses intersected three miles south of Cape Horn. Although mid winter in these latitudes, the weather was relatively mild with westerly winds at 35 to 40 knots. Almost colliding, they passed close by on opposite tacks. They hailed each other and found to their amazement that the opposite ship belonged to their brother.
